It is advisable to wait a few days after any release before updating to allow time for developers to work out any bugs. Always backup your site before updating your version of WordPress.

2. Backups

Regular backups of your site are important for keeping your site up-to-date and secure. If anything should go wrong with a plugin or, heaven forbid, hacking, you'll be able to restore a backup.

3. Plugins and Theme Updates

Various elements of your site are created by the use of plugins. The design of your site is controlled by a theme. Keeping your theme and all plugins up-to-date are important from a usability perspective as well as a security perspective.

4. Refreshing Content

Refreshing/updating the content of your site will keep it fresh in the eyes of the search engines as well as your users. A blog is a convenient way to add news about your business to your site. Notifications of Awards you've won, new products or services you've introduced as well as events you are hosting are all great pieces of content to share with your audience.
